Senator Claxon, Representative Meyer and esteemed committee members,

Thank you for considering my testimony in favor of LD 867.

My name is Rebekah Libby. I'm a licensed Assisted Living Administrator and a resident of Berwick. I have dedicated myself to caring for the elderly for the past 15 years, but in October found myself unemployed. I have been unable to find employment in the healthcare field due to the vaccine mandate in our state.

Not only has this affected my family financially, but I have multiple medical conditions that have been left untreated due to a lack of medical insurance.

I am hesitant to be vaccinated due to the reactions my immediate family have experienced, and lack of long-term safety studies. My father had a documented adverse reaction which took 7 months of medication to alleviate, and my otherwise healthy 24-year-old son, has experienced multiple medical symptoms including cardiac problems which physicians suspect are vaccine related.
