Good morning Senator Claxon, Representative Meyers, and esteemed committee members. I am here today to urge you to vote "ought to pass" for LD 867, An Act to Prohibit Mandatory COVID-19 Vaccinations to Allow for Informed Consent

My name is Kellie Welch. I live in Gorham, and I am a Licensed Radiologic Technologist in State of Maine.
