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Dear Senator Claxton, Representative Meyer, and Esteemed Committee Members,

I would like to thank you for your time and attention to this matter. I am writing to urge you to vote, "Ought to Pass" on Bill LD 867 – An Act to Prohibit Mandatory COVID-19 Vaccination for 5 Years to Allow for Safety Testing and Investigations into Reproductive Harm.

I have been a nurse for 10 years and I love what I do, it is my calling in this life. I started as an LPN and worked my way up, as a single mother, to a RN. I have close to \$50,000 in student loans for a profession that I can no longer practice due to my own medical decisions. I worked on the front line in the hospital with COVID patients for a year, wore the proper PPE followed standard practice without any ill effects.

To pay my bills, I am now working at home, staring a computer all day, making calls to sell people medical services or devices. There is no longer any hands-on patient care, which is what I was put on this earth to do. I must make a conscious effort every day not to fall into depression and for this I turn to God. Although I can pay my bills, that is all I can afford to do. The savings account has been all but used up. Gone are the extras I would do for my daughters and my grandsons. There are no more impromptu trips to museum or miniature golf or weekend getaways.

I received a phone call from my younger sister a couple weeks ago telling me that my dad was rushed to the ER via ambulance because he had lost consciousness four times after receiving his booster shot. The fear that I felt is indescribable and although he seems to be okay now, that fear is still there because we don't know the long-term effects.

I had COVID not too long ago. As soon as I felt the nasal congestion, I started taking Quercetin, increased my Vitamin D and C, Zinc, and gargled with Scope 3 times a day. I also did a nasal wash with 1% iodine 2 times a day. With these measures, my symptoms were well managed, and I was back to 100% in a week and a half. I do have asthma, so I was concerned when I was diagnosed. Now I have natural immunity but that isn't even acknowledged even though any other required vaccination for my profession recognizes natural immunity.
