Senator Curry, Representative Roberts and Members of the Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business.

My name is Dirk Gouwens and I am writing to you today as the Executive Director of the Ski Maine Association, a not for profit organization that represents the interests of the Alpine and Nordic Ski Centers in the State of Maine.

We applaud the sponsors of this resolve and the committee for considering it. There are several parts that we favor, but there are several other items that we be opposed to should this resolve be approved.

Ski Areas in Maine took the brunt of the economic hit in the tourism sector this past winter. Just as we were about to begin our season in November, Governor Mills essentially shut down tourism to the state due to ongoing concerns about residents from other states spreading the coronavirus in Maine. Out of state residents were required to either obtain negative covid test which were cost prohibitive in several neighboring states, or quarantine for two weeks which is not practical when you consider that the average ski vacation is 3-4 days. This policy continued until the end of March which was after many ski areas closed. We were also limited to 50 people indoors which severely impacted Food and Beverage business at ski areas.

To be clear, ski areas are in need of economic assistance after a difficult ski season. However, some of the restrictions in this resolve would not be favorable to ski areas. We are also confused about why golf courses are exempt from this program. Several of our ski areas have golf courses.

We would encourage the sponsors and the committee to continue to encourage the Department of Economic and Community Development to establish economic recovery grants for Maine tourism businesses like ski areas, but we also encourage the committee to wait to see the guidelines from the federal government to see if they would be more inclusive and able to assist more businesses in need.
