This amendment strikes and replaces the bill to reallocate the language establishing the Maine Workforce, Research, Development and Student Achievement Institute from the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A to Title 5. The amendment changes the membership of the Maine Workforce, Research, Development and Student Achievement Institute Steering Committee. It also adds a requirement that the institute align its work with the priorities established by the State's economic development strategy developed by the Department of Economic and Community Development.
