Testimony of Greg Payne

Before the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business

In Support of LD 1694: An Act to Create the Maine Redevelopment Land Bank Authority

May 13, 2021

Senator Curry, Representative Roberts, and members of the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business, my name is Greg Payne. I am the Director of the Maine Affordable Housing Coalition (MAHC).

MAHC is a diverse coalition of more than 135 private and public sector organizations including developers, architects, engineers, builders, investors, community action programs, public housing authorities, housing and service providers, advocates, and others working to advance solutions that create and preserve affordable housing in Maine.

MAHC supports LD 1694 because it would provide an additional tool to help municipalities address the severe shortage of affordable housing in Maine. The most recent American Community Survey data reveals that 20%, or more than 30,000 renter households statewide, are paying more than half of their income on housing costs and more than 70,000 renter households spend more than a third of their incomes on housing costs. Meanwhile, more than 25,000 Maine households are sitting on waiting lists for federal Housing Choice Vouchers.

In the face of this overwhelming need, the resources available to create affordable homes for Maine people are far too scarce. An annual average of only 230 new, affordable homes has been produced statewide over the past seven years. We must find new tools wherever possible to improve this anemic rate of production.

LD 1694 creates one such new tool, by helping Maine municipalities to convert vacant, abandoned, and tax delinquent properties into productive use. It also helps to alleviate the need for new construction, thereby preventing new greenhouse gas emissions while maintaining existing carbon storage in the property. To tackle climate change and use our resources wisely, we need to focus housing initiatives on places where needed infrastructure already exists.

We applaud those who have crafted this legislation and believe that the creation of a Maine Redevelopment Land Bank Authority would advance efforts to create the additional housing that Mainers need, while aiding those towns most in need of support.
