The economic value of the lodge tags issued to my lodge have had impact up and down the coast, but primarily in the area of our lodge. We have made the investment to be included in this lottery and to provide a safe and professional atmosphere for our clients. We have spent thousands on meeting this compliance. We have also invested thousands on upgrades and maintenance to ensure we provide an outstanding service. These investments have spread the wealth across our very small community in Northern Maine in an area that is deeply depressed. Every bit of tourism we can promote and bring to the area is a step in the right direction.
