As a wildlife biologist practicing here in Maine, I fully understand the precarious circumstances under which so many of our wildlife species live. Loss of habitat, human encroachment on their lives, and human activities to name a few that threaten their existence.

Therefore, I fully support <u>LD 883</u> - An Act To Protect Endangered Species Whose Life Cycles Include Maine Land or Waters.

Our Federally Listed Endangered Species, among them the Atlantic Salmon, live their lives with the daily threat of extinction. They are the last of their kind on the Eastern seaboard, a place that once supported their vibrant and large numbers. And the rivers of Maine are their Last Stand.
