Re: Support for LD 693: "An Act to Protect Inland Water Quality, Shorelines, Wildlife and Public Safety by Prohibiting Operation of a Wake Boat to Create an Enhanced Wake Close to Shore or in Shallow Water "

Dear Senator LaFountain, Representative Landry, and distinguished members of the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife,

My name is Dr. Rebecca Arsenault. I live at 19 Fawn Road in Gray Maine. I have had the pleasure and frustration of owning property on Little Sebago Lake since 1982. This property is my legal Maine residence. I can be reached at 207-897-8109. The purpose of this letter is to share my support for LD 693 which would prohibit operation of a wake boat close to shore or in shallow water.

I have observed the evolution of boat traffic and the nature of boats on Little Sebago Lake over the past 41 years. I have seen a significant increase in the number of boats, the size of boats, the horsepower of motors on boats year-in and year-out over these many years. All of these changes have impacted lake quality. I thought I had seen everything until wake boats began to appear on the lake approximately four years ago. If you have not seen one of these boats at high speed on a lake, I encourage you to do so.

I am blessed to have lake-front property that has a natural sandy beach that gradually slopes into the water. It is a perfect location for swimming. Over the years, I have watched my daughter, two grandsons and other family members enjoy this beach. However, my beach has dramatically changed over the past few years due to wake boat activity. I can sit on my beach, watch wake boats go zooming by and see instant beach erosion caused by the wave action of these boats. Sand on the beach is pulled into the water by wave action.

As a long-time lake property owner, I have always been mindful of protecting the lakefront by not touching the natural ecology of the bushes and trees along my property. It is so sad to see wake boat wave action dig up the natural lake front, causing bushes to be pulled into the lake and the roots of trees to be exposed by the wave action. I believe this law will help to prevent the devastating impact of wave boats on our beautiful lake.
