I am very concerned about the risks that the wake board boats pose to churning up toxins at the bottoms of lakes when they are operating a full capacity in less than 20-foot depths. By placing the motor boats further out in a lake it can prevent this from happening while still allowing the wakeboarders the enjoyment of their sport. Additionally, it keep high-speed boats away from the shoreline where our younger family members spend most of their time.
