Coyotes are an Apex Predator keeping our ecosystem in balance by preying on mice, rats, rabbits, and sickly deer. - •The presence of stable Coyotes on our Maine farms, protect the farm's hoofed livestock from the brain worm carried by deer. Deer do not just stand around in pastures all night when coyotes are present.
- When passed, this bill would not only give coyotes refuge from human behavior while they are bringing up their pups, but it will also help our farmers who rely on Coyotes to keep their farms' ecosystems healthy and balanced. And they do this by controlling the behaviors of herbivores, who can cause damage and spread disease. Our farmers feed us. We want them to be successful!"
