To the Members of the Judiciary Committee, my name is Joshua Jacques, a resident of Sidney, Maine, and I vehemently oppose LD 1126, "An Act Requiring Serial Numbers on Firearms and Prohibiting Undetectable Firearms." Bruen (2022) that the Second Amendment is not a second-class right, yet LD 1126 treats it as such by imposing serial number mandates that would never be tolerated akin to prior restraint on First Amendment freedoms—like requiring registration numbers on printing presses or banning untraceable books. This legislation stifles law-abiding Mainers' liberty, lacks historical grounding, and fails to address actual criminal misuse, instead targeting a fundamental right with bureaucratic overreach.
