To the Judiciary committee, My name is Michelle Zagardo and I am a constituent from Bethel. I am writing to express my strong opposition to LD 1007, which would require healthcare professionals to provide misleading and scientifically unproven information regarding the so-called "reversal" of medication abortions. Furthermore, this bill contributes to the broader pattern of stigmatizing and restricting abortion access under the guise of patient protection. Instead of forcing medical professionals to provide inaccurate and ideologically driven information, the Legislature should focus on ensuring that all individuals have access to comprehensive, science-based reproductive healthcare. I urge you to reject this harmful and misleading legislation and to uphold the integrity of medical care by allowing healthcare professionals to provide patients with accurate, evidence-based information free from political interference.
