My name is Richard Shapiro. I am from Brunswick, and am testifying in opposition to "LD 1379 An Act to Require Public Health Warnings to Be Posted and Provided by Firearm Dealers and Gunsmiths"

Please vote against this proposal.

First, the language of this proposal contains inaccuracies – the presence of guns does not increase the likelihood of suicide – this has been proven several times by studies both here and globally. A gun, if present, becomes a likely MEANS of suicide, but does not change the suicide rate.
