As a parent and a woman, I am very concerned about this group of bills that would force punitive measures on all girls. I do not want any official or spectator to be able to ask for a gender check on my daughter and athlete. That is invasive and I hope illegal. Title IX already prohibits, discrimination, and many of these bills will add discrimination for all girls. I want more student athletes in our state as athletics provides a structure, life, skills, and community. I want all our athletes to have access to competitive sports. Please do not allow any of these eight anti-trans bills to pass.
