Good morning. My name is Siiri Cressey; I am a citizen of Lewiston Maine + a member of The Maine People's Alliance. I am writing in protest against all of the bills being considered which would limit the school activities of transgender girls. Proponents of these bills use phrases like "protecting women + girls." I'm a woman, + I have been for my entire adulthood. Before that, I was a girl. I have never, not once, not ever, been threatened or in any way attacked by a transgender woman or girl. Not in bathrooms, not in locker rooms, not anywhere. The one time I was, the location was a public park + the perpetrator was a cisgender man. + yet, I don't hear anybody saying that cisgender men should not be allowed in city parks, nor would I agree with them if someone did. "We must protect women + girls from men in dresses" is utterly a straw man argument. Not only are trans women + girls not men + boys in dresses, I have yet to hear of a single credible case of a cis man or boy pretending to be a trans woman or girl in order to perv on them in bathrooms + locker rooms.
