This bill claims to be about fairness and safety, but at its core, it is about fear and exclusion. It targets transgender girls—young people who are simply trying to live as their authentic selves—and it tells them they are not welcome in school sports or facilities. That is wrong, and it is un-American.

Our country was built on the belief that everyone deserves equal treatment under the law. LD 1134 violates that principle. It proposes that the government—not families, not doctors, not students themselves—should have the final say in how a young person is recognized and respected. That's not fairness. That's government overreach.

Let's be clear: transgender girls are girls. They deserve the same opportunities as any other student—to play on a team, to change in a locker room, to use the bathroom safely and with dignity. Denying them those basic rights not only harms their mental and physical health, it also puts schools in direct conflict with federal protections under Title IX.

This bill would not make anyone safer. What it would do is single out already vulnerable students for surveillance, rejection, and punishment simply for being who they are. That's not protection. That's discrimination.

I urge you to think about what message this sends to every transgender kid in Maine. Are we telling them they're worthy of respect and belonging? Or are we telling them that no matter how hard they try, they will always be seen as less?

The real threats to girls in sports and schools are not trans youth—they are underfunding, inequity, and a lack of support. Let's focus our energy on fixing those problems, not creating new ones.

LD 1134 is a solution in search of a problem, and passing it would harm real students in real ways. Please vote no.
