According to Brenda Alvarez's 2022 article "Why Pronouns Matter," published by the National Association of Education, using the wrong name or pronouns for someone can be "harmful, and even threatening to a gender-diverse person." We must always strive to protect children, not harm them, and this bill will harm children. It needs to be stopped.

If this law passed, many trans and nonbinary children in public schools would be made to feel unsafe in our schools.
