Against LD 1337, LD 1432, LD,1002, LD 1704 and LD 380:

Dear Senator Carney, Representative Kuhn, and Honorable Members of the Judiciary Committee:

My son is transgender, and like any parent, my greatest hope for him is that he can live in a world where he is safe, valued, and free to live his truth.
