Sen. Carney, Rep. Kuhn, and Other Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary:

Please support and protect our public safety in Maine and vote Ought To Pass on LD 1971 - An Act to Protect Workers in This State by Clarifying the Relationship of State and Local Law Enforcement Agencies with Federal Immigration Authorities.

I believe LD 1971 supports and protects Maine citizens AND especially local police officers and law enforcement agencies by spelling out their responsibilities with regard to federal immigration authorities. All six items listed in the bill's summary are vitally important and necessary.

Unfortunately, you can't protect me, my family and our neighbors from a federal government that wrongfully sends someone to a terrible prison in El Salvador and then ignores a Court order to return them home, but I believe you CAN do something to protect us from ICE overreach throughout the State of Maine: please support LD 1971.
