When families live in fear, they're less likely to show up to work, school, or civic life. That means missed shifts, empty school desks, and fewer people participating in civic life. LD 1971 gives communities the stability they need to keep working, learning, and contributing to a stronger Maine.

As your constituent, and a Maine taxpayer, I do not want my tax dollars to be spent on harmful law enforcement activities vis-a-vis immigrant populations. Again, I urge you to vote in support of LD 1971.
