By imposing rigid definitions of "sex" that ignore gender identity, it sends the harmful message that transgender individuals are undeserving of the same rights and respect as other Mainers. In addition to being morally wrong, this bill would impact a fraction of a percent of people in our state. It seeks to solve a problem that doesn't exist, is discriminatory, and is entirely unnecessary.

The bill states that "athletic teams designated for females must be restricted to students whose sex is female, and athletic teams designated for males must be restricted to students whose sex is male."
