Many small businesses, like the one I have been proud to serve, already go above and beyond to support their workers during times of need—whether it's through informal leave arrangements, flexible scheduling, or direct financial support. Mandating a state-run program adds layers of bureaucracy, increases costs, and reduces the ability of employers to tailor solutions that work best for their teams. These added costs are ultimately borne by both employers and employees, and in many cases, by Maine taxpayers.

LD406 recognizes that Mainers know best how to care for their families and communities. By repealing the paid family and medical leave mandate and reimbursing taxpayers, this bill restores local control and relieves small businesses of unnecessary financial and administrative burdens. It allows employers to invest those resources directly into their workforce and community, rather than into a costly state program.
