Increase Housing Opportunities in Maine by Studying Zoning and Land Use Restrictions"

Senator Daughtry, Representative Sylvester, and members on the Committee on Labor and Housing, my name is Abigail Beal of Cherryfield, Maine. I am writing in opposition to LD 2003.

I do not believe that the state should be involved in legislating how municipalities will allow land to be used or developed within those towns or be required to comply with state regulations regarding such matters as population density, housing opportunities, zoning, or development opportunities.
