### SUMMARY

This bill is a concept draft to create a committee to study:

- 1. The relationship among county, municipal and state governments;
- 2. The roles of county government in other states;
- 3. Which, if any, of those roles might be beneficial in this State;
- 4. Whether the existing powers of county government are adequate to fill those roles; and

5. Whether the powers of county government should be increased to help county governments provide regional leadership in various areas, including health care, education data collection and workforce development.
