My name is David Manter, I live in Fayette, and I am here today to ask you to vote against L.D. 859. The purpose of ranked-choice voting is to deceive the public into thinking that if someone wins by 51% of the people who show up, that that person has got a mandate from the people of the town, when in fact it has two problems. Less than 50% of the registered voters could have voted, which means that no one actually got 51% or a mandate. Even if 80% of the people vote, if someone got 51% of the 80%, they would still not have a majority of the registered voters in that governmental entity. Also, because ranked-choice voting drops people from the voter roll and reduces the people who voted, the percentage of the overall count is now reduced, and the final percent is even lower.
