

MIRC TESTIMONY SUPPORTING LD1034

An Act to Provide Funding to Support the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial, Indigenous and Maine Tribal Populations

Good Morning Representative Mike Sylvester and Senator Joe Rafferty! My name is Mufalo Chitam and please accept my testify in <u>SUPPORT of LD1034</u> on behalf of the board and members of the <u>Maine Immigrants' Rights Coalition</u> (MIRC) a coalition with a commitment to advancing and defending the rights of immigrants.

Our mission is to improve the legal, social and economic conditions experienced by Maine's immigrants – enhancing their lives while strengthening Maine – through advocacy, information sharing and collaboration both through and among our member organizations. We strongly support providing funding to support the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial, Indigenous and Maine Tribal Populations

The populations we serve are very vulnerable, have experienced the worst atrocities and they bring with them historical trauma. MIRC acknowledges the enormous racial disparity in the COVID-19 data in our state. Our communities of color are in unfathomable pain, distress, and devastation due to the disproportionate impact on their overall wellbeing as well as limited access to services in the midst of the pandemic. These communities are more likely to get sick and die from Covid-19 than white Mainers. These disproportionate outcomes are a result of limited access to healthcare, and the constant barrage of racial abuses and ongoing violence our communities face on a daily basis due to systems built to sustain the status quo of white supremacy. Structural and individual racism is a public health emergency.

MIRC now has a new capacity that we didn't have before. Over the years, we have grown significantly to 77 member organizations. This has created an enormous opportunity for a larger leadership role on policy issues relevant to immigrants and in the coordination of Maine's diverse immigrant communities on initiatives that will advance integration.

We actively prioritize the voices, perspectives, and decision-making of New Mainer communities as we acknowledge the status quo of systems that consistently disadvantage them. We believe in the power of New Mainers to make Maine a better place for all who live here and so envision policies that will not exacerbate inequities across people of color, including divisions across the country of origin, socioeconomic status, state geography, language, and immigration status.

Maine has seen a growth of immigrants in the last 10 years but lacks Infrastructure to support their economic and social integration. From available data, we know that significant disparities in COVID19, poverty, wealth, income, and rates of incarceration exist in communities of color in our state. Not funding the commission is intentionally allowing inequities like this to continue harming our population A dedicated staffing and administrative support will enable our state to have a better understanding of these factors which are key to developing solutions and evaluations.

This bill will help empower the commission to conduct research and advise all three branches of government to provide a range of culturally and linguistically specialized services for the state's communities of color specifically the immigrant populations. LD 1034 will support critical racial equity work. and so, we urge this committee not to pass this bill.
