SUMMARY

The committee amendment replaces this concept draft bill so that the committee may fulfill its obligation under <u>3 MRSA §963</u> which states:

The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters shall review the provisions and effects of this chapter no later than June 30, 2022 and at least once every 10 years after June 30, 2022.

The amendment was emailed to the SLG interested parties' listserv and posted online on March 2, 2022.

The amendment updates the following 2 sections of the Government Evaluation Action (<u>3 M.R.S.A. ch. 35</u>)

1. Section 963, Review.

The amendment updates the language in this section by specifically authorizing the committee to report out a bill in response to its review and moves the date of the review from June 30 to March 30 to ensure the review occurs during session.

- 2. Section 959, Scheduling guideline for review of agencies or independent agencies
 - a. Updates the GEA report due dates by adding 8 years to the current date in statute; and
 - b. Moves the following reports into committees with specific jurisdiction
 - Medical Marijuana Program report moved from the HHS Committee to the committee having jurisdiction over the program; and
 - Maine State Housing Authority report moved from the IDEA Committee to the committee having jurisdiction over housing matters.

Amend this bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

An Act To Update Dates and Committees of Jurisdiction for the State Government Evaluation Act Review of Agencies

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

Be it enacted by the People of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §959, is amended to read:

§959. Scheduling guideline for review of agencies or independent agencies

1. Scheduling guidelines. Except as provided in subsection 2, reviews of agencies or independent agencies must be scheduled in accordance with the following. Subsequent reviews must be scheduled on an ongoing basis every 8 years after the dates specified in this subsection.

A. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and forestry matters shall use the following list as a guideline for scheduling reviews:

(1) Baxter State Park Authority in 20172025;

(2) Board of Pesticides Control in 20192027;

(3) Wild Blueberry Commission of Maine in 20192027;

(4) Maine Dairy and Nutrition Council in 20152023;

(5) Maine Dairy Promotion Board in 20152023;

(6) Maine Milk Commission in 20152023;

(7) State Harness Racing Commission in 20152023;

(8) Maine Agricultural Bargaining Board in 20172025;

(9) Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry in 20172025; and

(10) Land for Maine's Future Board in 20152023.

B. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over insurance and financial services matters shall use the following list as a guideline for scheduling reviews:

Sec. 2. 3 MRSA §963, is amended to read:

§963. Review

The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters shall review the provisions and effects of this chapter no later than June 30, 2022 March 30, 2032 and at least once every 10 years after June 30, 2022 thereafter. The committee may report out a bill during the session of the Legislature in which the review is completed.

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the title and replaces the concept draft bill. It updates the scheduling guideline dates in the Government Evaluation Act. It moves the report from the bureau or division within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services that administers and enforces the Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over the medical use of marijuana. It moves the report from the Maine State Housing Authority from joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters. It requires the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters to review the provisions and effects of the Governmental Evaluation Act by March 30, 2032 and every 10 years thereafter. It authorizes the committee to report out a bill based on its review.
