Dear Senator Baldacci and Representative Salisbury:

Please accept this letter concerning LD 247, An Act Regarding Recommendations for Changing Place Names in the State. This bill would create a Maine Board on Place Names, comprised of 11 members, including the State Geologist and Director of the Maine Geological Survey (MGS), a program within the Bureau of Resource Information and Land Use Planning at the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (DACF).

The Board would also include an employee of the Maine Office of Geographic Information Systems within the Office of Information Technology (OIT). This OIT employee would be a mapping professional and serve as an unofficial liaison between the Maine Board of Place Names and the U.S. Board on Geographic Names in the U.S. Department of Interior to make name changes or to name new places in a manner consistent with state intentions and federal requirements.

One change for your consideration concerns the responsibility of municipal officers and county commissioners to notify the United States Secretary of the Interior of the names of places as they appear on maps and other documents (see §1104. 2). It is unclear to us whether the OIT employee would take up the role that DACF has historically played as a liaison with the U. S. Board of Geographic Names. The proposed removal of DACF from this section puts the responsibility onto municipalities to determine contact information and existence for federal and other entities of which they may not be aware. If the OIT employee did not assume this role, we recommend that, in the interest of providing service to municipalities and counties, DACF remain the point of contact given the historical relationships between MGS and the U.S. Board on Geographic Names.
