

Budget Committee Member – Written Testimony

Senator Baldacci, Representative Salisbury, and honorable members of the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government:

My name is Georg Haubs and I am a **nominated member (pending a quorum for appointment)** of the Knox County Budget Committee, representing District 1 (Isle Au Haut, Matinicus Isle Plantation, North Haven, St. George, Friendship and the Unorganized Territory of Criehaven). I am writing to you today to urge you to vote "Ought to Pass" on **LD 2158, An Act to Address Vacancies on the Knox County Budget Committee.**

I am submitting this testimony not just as a resident, but as one of the few prospective members of a committee that is currently legally paralyzed.

The "Catch-22" Deadlock Our committee is supposed to have nine members. Currently, we only have four. Under the Knox County Charter, we need a quorum of five members to conduct *any* official business. This includes the business of appointing new members to fill vacancies.

We are trapped in a circular deadlock: We cannot meet because we lack a quorum, and we cannot appoint new members to get a quorum because we cannot meet. This bill acts as the "key" to unlock that door, allowing the County Commissioners to temporarily appoint members so we can get back to work.

Impact on Taxpayers and Public Safety Because of this technical paralysis, we have been unable to fulfill our statutory duty to review and approve the 2026 Knox County Budget. This isn't just administrative paperwork; this delay impacts real services. The Sheriff's Office, Dispatch, the Jail, and the Airport rely on a timely budget to operate effectively. Operating on a stalled or interim budget creates uncertainty and potentially harms the public safety services our constituents rely on.

Restoring Checks and Balances The Budget Committee exists to provide citizen oversight on county spending—a vital check and balance on the Commissioners. Right now, that oversight is nonexistent because our hands are tied. Passing LD 2158 is not a power grab; it is a restoration of democracy. It allows us to seat members so that the people of Knox County once again have a voice in how their tax dollars are spent.

Conclusion We are ready and willing to do the work we were elected to do, but we need the Legislature's help to untie this knot. Please pass this emergency legislation so we can convene a quorum, pass a budget, and serve our neighbors.
