## VOTE OUGHT NOT TO PASS LD 1133

Although it may not seem like it, the climate emergency is at the forefront of LD 1133. The Governor's Climate Council Report states that the impact of the transportation sector on the climate emergency needs to be addressed, so as a state, we should be looking to passenger rails. Passenger rails are on average 3x more efficient than a car, meaning, passenger rails lower the carbon footprint of each passenger who would otherwise be using a car as transportation.
