Testimony of Larz von Huene In Support of LD 1020

Senator Nangle, Representative Crafts, and Honorable Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation

My name is Larz von Huene, I live in Portland, ME, and I am writing as someone who works on trails in the area, and one who dreams of a Maine that doesn't rely so heavily on cars.

I support LD 1020 because:

- The MTA's own studies said a highway would make a tiny difference in commute times, perhaps 4 minutes on average. Like many projects expanding vehicle infrastructure, it does not address the core need to reduce the number of single passenger vehicles. Public transit, carpooling programs, and bike/multi-use trails will all decrease the density of cars on the road, saving people time and promoting health and wellness.
- There's no route for this highway that would not cut through Smiling Hill Farm, a rare surviving local dairy farm, one of the oldest family-owned small businesses in the country and a community staple. Is this worth a likely temporary 4-minute reduction in commute?
- Scarborough and Westbrook have said they don't want a highway, that it 'does not align with their values.'
