LD 554 An Act to Create Gaming Equity and Fairness for the Native American Tribes in Maine

During the public hearing on LD 554 (3/17/2021), Rep. Dolloff asked for information about the population of the states that have Tribal-state compacts and the numbers of tribal casinos in each of those states. In response to Rep. Dolloff's request, I have compiled the table below. This table lists the 27 states that have negotiated and approved Class III Tribal-state gaming compacts under IGRA, the number of compacts in each state, the number of Tribal casinos in each state and the population for each state, according to 2010 U.S. Census data.
