SADC in the past has been neutral on the proposed construction of casinos in the region and is still neutral regarding casinos. However, when LD 554 was explained to us, we are supportive of the bill. The name says it all. Create Gaming Equity. All the bill does is put the Maine Tribes on the same playing field as the 500 plus tribes in the United States and the 49 other states. Maine Tribes have not been able to negotiate directly with the state.

This bill corrects that long injustice to the Maine Tribes. It does not guarantee construction of a casino.

Southern Aroostook Development Corporation, no matter how one feels about casinos, believes in equity for our native American citizens in Maine.

We urge you to vote "Ought to Pass" when you come out of committee with this bill. It is the right thing to do.
