## LD 1434, An Act Regarding Controlled Entry Areas within Retail Marijuana Stores

# Summary

This bill allows a marijuana store to have a controlled indoor entry area, directly inside the store where the identification of a purchaser can be verified and the purchaser can await entry into the sales area. The area must be physically separated from the sales area of the store, prevent a purchaser in the area from viewing adult use marijuana or adult use marijuana product displayed for sale in the store and have a means to prevent a purchaser from entering the sales area except as permitted by an employee of the store who is present in the entry area.

### Sec. 1. 28-B MRSA §504, sub-§9 is enacted to read:

- 9. Controlled indoor entry area. A marijuana store may have a controlled, indoor entry area directly inside the marijuana store in which the identification of a purchaser may be verified and a purchaser may await entry into the sales area of the marijuana store. A controlled, indoor entry area under this subsection must:
- A. Be physically separated from the sales area of the marijuana store;
- B. Prevent a purchaser in the controlled, indoor entry area from viewing adult use marijuana or adult use marijuana product displayed for sale in the marijuana store; and
- C. Have a means to prevent entry of a purchaser from the controlled, indoor entry area into the sales area except as permitted by an employee of a marijuana store who is present in the controlled, indoor entry area.
