CERTAIN SPORTS WAGERS PROHIBITED					
Prohibited Wagers					No wagering on injuries or penalties or the outcome of disciplinary rulings or replay reviews
Request from a sports governing body					Requests from sports governing body will be reviewed
Abnormal wagering activity					Operator will report if noticed and cooperate with investigations and maintain confidentiality of inquiry unless sports governing body consents to disclosure. Sports governing body must also maintain confidentiality unless operator consents
OFFICIAL LEAGUE DATA					
Results Determination					An operator is not required to use official league data for Tier 1 events headquartered in US or Tier 2 events that are not headquartered in US

Use of Official League Data Notification				Tier 2 governing bodies can request to the Director that official league data be used

SECURITY, MAINTENANCE AND SHARING OF WAGERING RECORDS				
Records Maintenance				Operator must maintain records of all wagers placed including identifiable information of the bettor, amount and type of wager, time of wager, location of wager, including the IP address if applicable, the outcome of the wager and instances of abnormal activity for 3 years after the sports event occurs as well as video recordings in the case of in person wagers for at least one year after the sports event occurs
Anonymized information				Operator will use commercially acceptable practices to provide anonymized (unidentifiable info) data of a bettor and amount and type of wager, time of wager, location of wager, including the IP address if applicable, the outcome of the wager and instances of abnormal activity

Records Monitoring				If sports governing body needs info from above necessary for the integrity of the activity, then it will be shared
