This bill is calling for excessive testing, aside from being excessive, the cost of the additional testing will actually put many growers out of business as they already have little to no profit room.....Needless track-and-trace requirements will add additional unneeded paperwork and expenses to hard-working caregivers that are barely staying afloat. Also the arbitrary potency limits across all cannabis products well again put additional stress and a stranglehold over small businesses and caregivers.
