I support LD 1672. This bill allows for AU operators to have an option to use the track and trace system. The Metrc platform is a complete waste of state and stakeholder money. Metrc creates a crazy amount of unnecessary work and cost for operators. It also creates tons of one time use plastic from it tags which are not recyclable and go directly into Maine landfills. It keeps no one "safe" and to my knowledge hasn't ever been used for any investigation. The only people that benefit from Metrc are the corrupt Metrc stakeholders.
