Mr. Miesburger was a veteran of the United States Air Force, retiring as a Master Sergeant with many years of active duty service in aircraft crash rescue and firefighting services, as chief of the Fire Protection Branch at several air bases in France, England and Alaska and as a Fire Protection Advisor assigned to Headquarters, Republic of Korea Air Force. After retiring, he was employed by the United States Air Force as Fire Chief at Loring Air Force Base and Hanscom Air Force Base, as well as Fire Station Attendant for the Town of Limestone. In the 1990s, he owned a successful fire prevention and safety business throughout Aroostook County. He was a life member of Lister-Knowlton VFW Post 9389, American Legion Post 15, VFW National Home, the Air Force Association, the Vietnam Veterans of America and Disabled American Veterans. He was a member of the Military Order of the Cootie and of the Korean Service Veterans' Association. He was a past Commander of the Department of Maine VFW, National VFW Chief of Staff, past Commander District One, Department of Maine VFW, Post Commander VFW Post 9389 for 5 terms and Quartermaster of VFW Post 9389. He was a founding father of the Northern Maine Veterans Cemetery in Caribou and a member of the Board of Trustees of Maine Veterans' Homes.
