(1-16) Calvin Temple, of Bowdoinham. Mr. Temple was a retired lieutenant of the Sagadahoc County Sheriff's office. He was a dedicated public servant who served Sagadahoc County with honor and distinction, leaving an enduring legacy of kindness and commitment. Known for his exceptional storytelling and warm personality, he brought joy and connection to the community's residents. His wit, wisdom and unique ability to make people laugh will be remembered by all who had the privilege of knowing him. Mr. Temple will be long remembered and sadly missed by his family, friends and community;

Over the next 42 years, Mr. Malaby made the Crocker House Country Inn in Hancock Point the heart of the community. He transformed the Crocker House into a beloved gathering place, welcoming guests from near and far. Active in his community, he served as Chair of Maine Coast Memorial Hospital and on the Hancock School Board. Later, he was elected to the Maine House of Representatives, where he served two terms and was a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. He also taught as an adjunct college professor. After moving to Wiscasset, he served on Wiscasset's Economic Development Committee and championed fundraising efforts at St. Philip's Episcopal Church. He was also a member of the Lincoln Theater in Damariscotta. Mr. Malaby will be long remembered and sadly missed by his family, friends and community;
