In 1976, he began his tenure at Boothbay Region High School teaching math and coaching varsity boys basketball. He retired from teaching in 2017 but continued coaching for an additional three years. Mr. Pinkham holds the distinction of being the winningest coach in Maine boys' basketball history, with his teams achieving an extraordinary 659 victories. A pinnacle of his coaching career was leading the Boothbay Seahawks to the Class C State Championship in 2001. Some other professional accomplishments were his induction into the Maine Basketball Hall of Fame in 2016 and the Midcoast Sports Hall of Fame in 2017 and receiving the Wooden Award of Excellence from the Maine Basketball Hall of Fame in 2023. He was a Rotarian, receiving the Paul Harris Fellow award, volunteered at the Boothbay Region YMCA and coached summers at Hoop Camp. Mr. Pinkham will be long remembered and sadly missed by his family, friends and community;
