WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret of the death of:

(1-8) Joel D. Sankey, of Brewer. Mr. Sankey was a veteran of the United States Air Force, serving during the Vietnam War from 1967 to 1970. After his service, he moved to Brewer and served the Bucksport community and other communities as an educator and coach. He devoted over 50 years of his life to teaching history at Bucksport High School. In addition to being a teacher who was beloved by his students, Mr. Sankey was a respected coach, mentoring student-athletes in football, basketball and track at Bucksport High School, Maine Maritime Academy and Bangor High School. In 2004, he coached the Bucksport Golden Bucks to a Class C State Football Championship. Mr. Sankey will be long remembered and sadly missed by his family, friends and community;
