He served on our town Select Board for many years. We all know that is worth a tribute alone. But not only did he begin his service in our humble small town, but he chose to stay. That speaks volumes to the character of Dr. Joe. He is not one for public recognition and I am truly honored to be able to have this opportunity to recognize his commitment to our community. Honored to be able to say a very worthy public thank you to him for the dedication of over 30 years to rural Maine.

A few weeks ago, as you drove past the farm, there were moving trucks loaded with equipment that were headed to their new home. She can be described as a magnificent, compassionate person who is kind at all times, with a heart of gold. She is truly missed and never forgotten. She is survived by her husband, Richard, children, Jimmy, Sandra, Isabel and Natasha. I personally have known Nicole and Richard for about 30 years. They raised four kids, all who follow in the footsteps of their parents as great business people but, more importantly, great people. I think they got that from their mother. I consider it a blessing in my life to have known Nicole. Rest in peace, Nicole.
